SUBJECT: Policy and Requirements Handbook (PRH) Chapter 6, Section 6.10, R1.c:

Entrance Laboratory Testing Requirements

- 1. <u>Purpose</u>. To update the PRH regarding Job Corps entrance pelvic examination and Pap smear requirements for women, to be consistent with a change in recommendations by the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG).
- 2. <u>Background</u>. Pelvic examination with Pap smear screening was previously required for all women upon entry to Job Corps. In December 2009 a new clinical management guideline was released by ACOG recommending that Pap smear screening begin at age 21 years regardless of age of onset of sexual activity. This recommendation was based on (a) a very low incidence of cervical cancer in younger women; (b) a high incidence of human papillomavirus (HPV) infection that will spontaneously clear; and (c) a risk of adverse effects associated with follow-up of young women with abnormal cytology on screening.
- 3. <u>Reference</u>. ACOG Practice Bulletin No. 109: Cervical Cytology Screening (2009), *Obstetrics and Gynecology* 114(6):1409-1420.
- 4. <u>Explanation of PRH Changes</u>. The "Entrance Laboratory Testing Requirements—Females Only" table in PRH Chapter 6, Section 6.10, R1.c should be revised as follows:

Entrance Laboratory Testing Requirements—Females Only	Required Time Frame
Pregnancy Test (urine)	Within 48 hours after arrival
	All females age ≥ 21 years (unless documented Pap smear results within 24 months before arrival on center)
Pap Smear	Within 14 days after arrival
	Students under age 21 years only require pelvic/speculum exam for clinical indications such as pelvic pain, vaginitis, menstrual disorders, pregnancy, etc.
	All females; perform on urine if age < 21 years
Chlamydia Testing (endocervical or urine)	Within 48 hours after arrival (or at time of pelvic exam if age ≥ 21 years)
	All females; perform on urine if age < 21 years
Gonorrhea Testing (endocervical or urine)	Within 48 hours after arrival (or at time of pelvic exam if age ≥ 21 years)

- 5. <u>Explanation of PAG Changes</u>. Changes in PAG Chapter 6, Section 6.10, R1.c are also in the table "Entrance Laboratory Testing Requirements—Females Only" and are identical to those shown above. There are no other changes to PAG Chapter 6.
- 6. <u>Action Required</u>. Addressees are to ensure that this Change Notice is distributed to all appropriate staff.
